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ACC-CRJ 110 Intro to Crim Jus

****Students enrolled in this course must be concurrently enrolled in ACC.****

ACC Course: CRJ-110 Intro to Criminal Justice

Introduces students to the basic components of the criminal justice system in the United States. Concepts of crime, crime data, victimization, perspectives and views of crime, theory, and law are discussed. Particular attention to the criminal justice process, interaction and conflict between criminal justice agencies, and current criminal justice issues are examined.

ACC-CRJ 125 Policing Systems

****Students enrolled in this course must be concurrently enrolled in ACC.****

ACC Course: CRJ-125 Policing Systems

Examines the complexity and multi-dimensional aspects of the law enforcement role and career; law enforcement discretion; law enforcement values and culture in modern America. Covers the role and functions of law enforcement in an occupational, social, racial and ethnic, political and organizational context.

ACC-CRJ 145 Correctional Proc - (NEW)

ACC Course: CRJ-145 Correctional Process

Focuses on the post-conviction corrections process, the development of a correctional philosophy, theory, and practice, a description of institutional operation, programming and management, and community-based corrections, probation, and parole.

ACC Course: CRJ-230 Criminology






